


Information about Levoča

Levoča is a town in northeastern Slovakia, located in the Prešov region





Life

- -birth: 1680 in Ožďany
- died: 25 th September 1714 in Hungary
- parents: Žigmund Géci and Judita Bakošová

Until she was 16, she lived with David Absolón at Mukacevo Castle.

In 1700 she married for Ján Korponay.



They had a son, Gabriel. She also lived in Banská Bystrica in a house that is preserved to this day. She was arrested and charged with espionage and treason and imprisoned at Červený Kameň Castle.

A total of three years. They tortured her. Juliana was executed on 25 th September 1714 at the Rába market.

The legend 1:

The White Lady of Levoča Júlia Géciová-Korponayová, long known as the White Lady of Levoča, was the first and allegedly the only woman in the whole of Hungarian history to commit treason. However, she was wrongly accused and punished. Well, spies have never had it easy in their lives ... The injustice they committed to her will not rest her peace even today. Apparently you can sometimes see her wandering the streets of Levoča or peeking from behind the city walls. But be careful not to end up in a cage of shame right on Levoča Square.





The legend 2:

One of the legends says that Juliana, in love with the commander of the enemy imperial army, stole the keys to the city gate from the mayor at the ball and betrayed her city out of love.
